


Cities don't grow like Plants

2050: 2/3 of the world population will live in cities

Cities are **human made** and designed historically **by male technicians and planners**

- -> strong bias
- -> tendency to see the city only as a technical system

Norms for Calibration - Why Gender Glasses are Important

Walking speeds of different groups

	speed	time for 1 km	distance in 10 min
healthy adult	5 km/h	12 min	833 m
teenagers	6,5 km/h	9 min	1 083 m
young and elderly	2,5 km/h	24 min	417 m
reduced mobility	1,8km/h	33 min	300 m

- -> acceptable distances for parks and playgrounds, stops of public transport
- -> calculation of traffic lights

Climate Michel

Subjective feeling of temperature in micro climate models, calculated on average size and weight, but age of 35 years! Heat vulnerable groups are much more relevant

Automated driving: safety software

Calibrated on the faces of white men, bias in perception of colored women

Gender Planning- to Stand in Different Shoes

Planning as a complex field of action: market forces < - > common interests

Gender planning is a quality assessment of planning decisions and processes in regards to equal opportunities for different user groups

- -> higher social intelligence in planning processes
- -> specification of common welfare



Gender-sensitive Park Design

1997: "Foul Play with Opportunities? — Girls into Public Space!" socio- scientific survey -> specific interests of girls have to be considered

2000: strategic project within the City's Strategy Plan


since 1999: 6 model projects - 4 with active participation of girls

evaluation: usability analysis of 5 parks, design analysis of 14 parks

2006: evaluation workshop -> planning recommendations for gender-sensitive park- and playground design

Mainstreaming: Every new or redesigned park follows the principles


Mobility Needs and Patterns

Women

have lower incomes
possess less cars
have less choice of transport means
do more care work, have complexer
everyday lifes and mobility patterns
have a higher number of daily journeys
spend more time for shorter distances per day
are more sensitive towards safety aspects

than **men**

Gender sensitive traffic planning considers the mobility conditions of both sexes and different gender roles



Gender Sensitive Mobility Pilot District Mariahilf


Mariahilf: small, central district,

28.000 inhabitants, 1,5 km², high density

Why Mariahilf as Gender Mainstreaming Pilot District?

- district women's commission
- focus on improving conditions for pedestrians
- district decision on Gender Mainstreaming

Participants: 7 municipal departments charged with public space







Outcomes



- street crossings
- pedestrian-friendly traffic lights
- enlarging pavements
- lighting projects
- barrier-free pavements
- additional seating

Hardware:

- separate lanes and safe crossings increase the usage by women and children

Results

- Better transit quality
- -> clear routing enables orientation and overwiew
- -> elimination of spaces of anxiety, increase of social control

Better quality of sejour


- -> reduction of spaces of irritation and uncomfort
- -> better chances of appropriation for vulnerable groups
- -> more facilities for interaction or at least conflict-free coexistence
- -> better microclimate: 57 new trees, water arch, infiltration, more open ground
- -> fitness and playelements next to the main paths
- -> girl's stage for cultural activites
- Conflicting aims
- bikers- pedestrians routes, outdoor restaurant consumption free zones





Gender Mainstreaming Pilot Projects

8 municipal departments of planning and traffic sector realised pilot projects

at least **2 p.a.**, **scope of action**: urban planning, urban design, land use, road construction, bridge construction, lightning, traffic organisation

since 2006: **42 pilot projects**, scales range from **1:200** (road construction) to **1:12 000** (urban development)

Functional Scheme - desire lines of pedestrians

Walks with wheelchairs and prams to feel the obstacles

Night walk to identify spaces of anxiety

Visibility of different groups in participation processes

Co creation supports appropriation


Evaluation: planning as a learning system

Symbolic level: street names, monuments, pictogramms



Climate as the new challenge

Climate change: Urban Heat Island, heavy rains...
->
necessity to organize a post fossil world much faster then estimated to fight the Climate
crisis

the identification of synergetic potentials as gender planners are inclusion of needs of cumulative vulnerabilities and specific demands map overlaying Urban Heat Islands/ vulnerable groups (age, economy..)

-> 11 high risk areas as prioritized action areas: concept of street gardens

Vienna has a decreasing number of cars/inhabitants, but challenge of streetparking

Gender Planning as a transformative force

Gender planners are often many years ahead of mainstream

Transformation as communication issue needs a gender lens for the acceptance of measurements

-> pragmatic utopias and scenarios and broad dialogues

Visions and Ideas

Functional concept for different parks and playground based on social space analysis-Malmö has thematic playgrounds

More co-creation activities and participation, active use of the potential of girls and women

Arte Povera-Learning from the Global South

Commons: street cooperative by citizens, managing private car share, no other parking facilities, park lanes are used for trees, flower and herbs beds, sheds, bike stalls, neighbourhood gardens, sidewalk cafes, fees for car and bike sharing and open areas of restaurants are used for operating costs and new equipment, watering management in hot periods
